Help Keep Things Moving...

Our hard working Sewer and Water Department personnel have noticed an increase in sewer problems dealing with grease build-up in our Town sewer lines. Grease does not belong in our sewer lines, it belongs in the garbage.

Not only does grease form buildup in the lines, which reduces the flow of water in the system, it forms a gas known as Hydrogen Sulfide (H₂S). It is very corrosive acid and colorless with the characteristic of a distinct odor of rotten eggs. It is poisonous, corrosive, and a flammable gas that eats away our concrete manholes and asbestos concrete sewer lines. If we work together to reduce the amount of grease going into our sewer lines, as well as private septic systems, we can lengthen

the lifespan of our sewer systems which ultimately reduces our long term expenses.

So, I am asking you to remember this...if you have excess grease from cooking, please dispose of it in the garbage, NOT in the drains. You can pour the hot grease in an aluminum can, let it cool down so it solidifies, then drop it in the garbage can for safe disposal.

As always, thank you for your anticipated cooperation. It is much appreciated!

A special guest article from Acting Sheriff Michael Filicetti, Niagara County Sheriff's Office:

I recently had the opportunity to sit with the Lockport Town Board and explain some of the services offered by the Niagara County Sheriff's Office to the residents of Lockport and all of Niagara County. It was good to talk to the board about my passion for protecting the people and residents of our great county.

Every citizen should have the opportunity of being aware of every day occurrences that can impact the roads you drive on or emergencies that occur. NY-Alert is a web based portal that allows state, county and local governments, emergency service agencies, colleges and universities, and private partners to provide emergency alert information and private notifications to a defined audience. NY-Alert warns citizens of critical information/emergencies and provides timely information to protect lives. Sign up for NY-Alert today to receive real-time warnings and emergency information directly via phone call, email, text message or fax. You can sign up for NY-Alert at alert.ny.gov.

One concern many people have is the security of their homes while they are away on vacation. The Sheriff's Office regularly checks on houses and property all around Niagara County and we will gladly check on your house as part of our patrol in the Town of Lockport. It is reassuring to know that we have your back and will keep an eye on things when you are unable to. If you would like a check of your property while you are away, please call the main dispatch number, (716) 438-3393, to speak to a professional dispatcher and give the information for your home check. Along the same lines is the security of our most highly valued items like cars and recreational vehicles. I want to encourage each of you to remember to lock your car doors and remove all valuables from your vehicles when you have gone into your house for the night. If you have to leave anything of value outside while you are not there, make sure that you have secured it with a chain or some other device that will prevent it from being stolen. Our deputies are on the streets all the time but some simple steps like this may prevent you from becoming the victim of a crime.

In addition to these services, we have also partnered with the

Niagara County Office for the Aging to equip vulnerable adults with GPS location bracelets. These bracelets are available for use with special needs children as well. If you are in need of this service you can contact Captain Robert Richards at (716) 438-3331 to discuss your need and come up with a plan to help you through this process.

We also have a number of trained child safety seat technicians and we conduct bike rodeos throughout either Niagara County or county in the warmer months. The child safety seat technicians can inspect your car safety seat and give instruction on how to properly install this valuable safety item in your car. Traffic Safety Educator Cathleen Davis can be contacted at (716) 438-3464 to arrange a car seat installation or safety check and she is always a great resource.

One additional program I would like to make you aware of is the Yellow Dot Program. This program is designed to give first responders critical information about you and your family in the event of an accident or emergency in your home. When the yellow dot is located on your vehicle or house by a first responder, they know to look for important information, compiled by you, to assist in your family's medical treatment or conditions. Information regarding this program, as well as packets to get you started, can be obtained by contacting the Sheriff's office at (716) 438-3310. Yellow dot packages have been left at the Lockport Town Hall as well.

- By law, all cats, dogs and domesticated ferrets must have a current rabies vaccination from four months of age and on.
 - Cats and dogs receiving immunization WITHOUT PROOF of a previous rabies immunization will receive a certificate valid only for one year. Cats and dogs WITH PROOF of previous rabies immunizations will receive a certificate valid for three years.
 - Ferrets must receive vaccinations annually, regardless of previous immunization.
 - **All Animals** must be properly restrained. Cats & Ferrets must be in a box or carrier. Dogs must be leashed.
 - **The Department does not offer dog or cat vaccinations other than rabies. It is very important for the health and well being of your animal and the other animals attending our rabies clinics, that they have seen a veterinarian and are up to date on all of their immunizations, to include dog parvo virus.**
 - Volunteers are needed. Please call 439-7511 if interested.
 - It is requested that anyone bringing more than six animals to one clinic contact the Niagara County Department of Health at 439-7511 up to one week prior to the clinic so paperwork can be processed more efficiently.

Town Historian



Happy New Year! Not only are we in a new year, but a new decade. (Or are we? Some say the new decade begins January 1, 2021.) The United States launches each new decade (or year ending in 0) with a federal census. The census, described in Article 1, Section 2 of the Constitution, is required every ten years. The first census commenced in 1790 under the

direction of Thomas Jefferson.

In addition to the federal census, the State of New York used to administer a decennial census, beginning in 1825. The 1885 census was not undertaken because Governor David B. Hill considered a state census redundant to the federal census and “[...] an absolute waste of the people’s money.” The next state census was performed in 1892 under Governor Roswell P. Flower. Regular enumeration beginning in the 5th year of each decade resumed in 1905. In 1931, the state census was abolished, leaving 1925 as the last state census.

Census data allocates funding for the Town, as well as for the State. It also determines how many congressional representatives New York is apportioned. An accurate count in Census 2020 will not only affect our government and community for the next ten years but it has long-lasting historical implications.

If you have performed any genealogical, sociological, or historical research, you have probably utilized census records. This data can be used to trace family histories, regional development, and much more. By completing the census, you are adding to the historical record! Your ancestors will be able to search through this year’s survey in the year 2092. (Census data with personally identifiable information such as names and addresses remain confidential for 72 years. For example, 1950 census records will be released in 2022.)

Let’s look back on Lockport’s census data.

Population tallies through its early years:

1825: 3,007	1845: 9,314	1865: 13,937
1835: 6,092	1855: 13,386	1870: 3,032

Why the drastic drop in population? The City of Lockport was formed from the Town in 1865. In 1870, the City’s population was 12,426, adding the Town’s tally, the total citizenry was 15,458. The region was still growing--and it still is! According to the 2010 census, the Town had 20,529 residents.

Here are some agricultural and industrial statistics from 1825--a year after the Town formed--through 1845. It is a good way to envision the Town’s growth. During this 20-year span, the population tripled.

The number of asheries (factories which turned hardwoods into potash and lye) and sawmills indicate the Town was busy clearing forests and erecting buildings. Residents were also beginning to enjoy the fruits of their labor with the addition of distilleries, breweries, and taverns.

Hope you enjoyed this flashback--and if you did, imagine how your ancestors will feel looking back in 2092. Fill out your census surveys when they arrive next month. You do not even have to count your sheep!

Mailboxes: If your mailbox has been hit by our plow, please call the highway office, 439-9522, and we will replace it. If you live on a county road and your mailbox was hit, please call Niagara County at 439-7360. If you live on a state road and your mailbox was hit, please call NYSDOT at 438-2396.

Yard Damage: If your yard has been damaged by our snowplow please call the highway office. The highway clerk will take your information & we will be around when the weather is better to fix any damages.

Refuse/Recycling: Please have your garbage and recycling out by 6 am. Also remember, if your garbage and/or recycling aren't picked up, there could be a number of reasons. The truck could've broken down, there may be a new driver on the route, truck has to be dumped, etc. If it still isn't picked up by 3 pm, call the highway office and the clerk will call our Waste Management rep to see what the issue is. Also, please remember Waste Management only has the following holidays off: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving & Christmas.

Brush Pick-Up: Brush pick up will start the third Monday in March and continue until November. Please have your brush out by Sunday night. We pick up throughout the whole town. If you don't have it out by the time we come around, you will have to wait until the next month.

Road Work: As the weather gets warmer, please be cautious when our employees, along with county and state employees, are working on the roads. They work hard to keep our roads looking good. Obey the flagmen and signs to ensure safety. Thank you and we appreciate your cooperation.

TOWN OF LOCKPORT ELECTRONICS RECYCLING SHED REOPENS IN MARCH!

New York passed The Electronic Equipment Recycling and Refuse Act. In 2015, it became unlawful for residential households in New York to place electronic equipment at the curb for disposal.

New York State law requires manufacturers to take responsibility for recycling many types of electronic equipment they have produced. Like so many laws that are passed without the necessary thought as to the effects of each law, many of the required companies do not have a program in place yet to accept the electronic waste.

As a stop gap measure until these companies develop their electronic waste programs, the Town will reopen our electronic waste shed behind Town Hall on Dysinger Road. However, recycling electronics costs the town up to 9 cents a pound. Since we are not charging a fee for this service, we are limiting usage strictly to **Town of Lockport Residents** (please be prepared to show ID).

The hours of operation for the Town of Lockport Recycling Shed are: The last Saturday of each month, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM, March 28th through November. NO after hour drop-offs will be permitted. Cameras are in place to protect and enforce the program.
